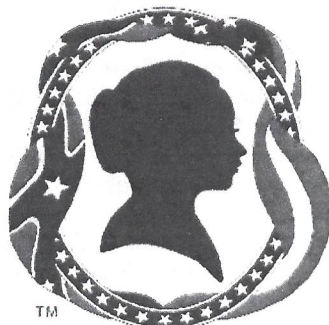

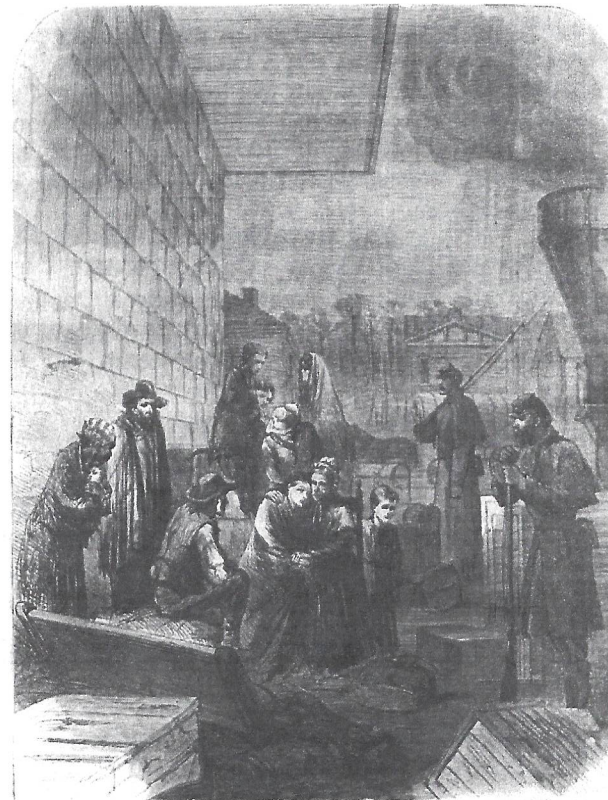

1:30 PM - *I Had Rather Die: Rape in the Civil War*, Kim Murphy

This presentation exposes the misconceptions about the topic of rape during the war. Not only were women raped during times of battle, but those who bravely stepped forward to name their attackers were interrogated in the justice system, often by their assailants.

2:30 PM - *Send Them Up The River! Rosecrans and the "Public Women" of Nashville*, Polly Steenhagen

By 1862 Nashville had almost 2,000 prostitutes in the city ready and eager to help separate lonely Union soldiers from their paychecks. Come hear the story of how Gen. Rosecrans tried to deal with this unusual dilemma in the middle of a war.

3:30 PM - *Women and Children First – Rethinking the Civil War Evacuation of Atlanta*, Lisa Tendrich Frank

By examining the published and unpublished wartime writings of Union soldiers and Confederate women, this presentation explains how the evacuation of Atlanta became a conflict between the men of the Union Army and women of Atlanta.

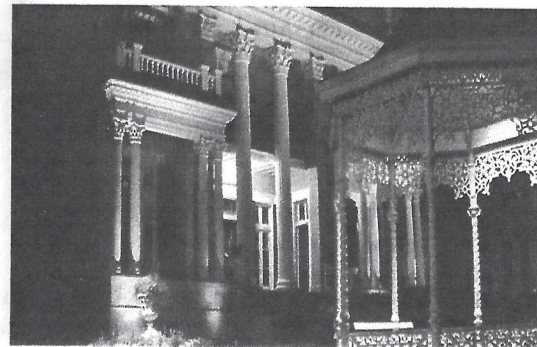

The moving spirit behind Belmont Mansion is **Adelia Hayes Franklin Acklen Cheatham**. Adelia inherited a huge estate including: 8,700 acres of cotton plantations in Louisiana; Fairvue, a farm in Tennessee; acres of undeveloped land in Texas; stocks and bonds; and 750 slaves. In 1846, at the age of 29, Adelia Franklin was independently wealthy, worth about \$1 million. Come hear the rest of her story and then tour her home.
