the defenses of Washington especially when battle

Library of Medicine, National Institute of Health. First hospital sponsored by the United States government to meet the health care needs of ex-slaves and black soldiers both during and after the Civil War. Its staff, including nurses and surgeons, were also largely African American.

11:00 AM to NOON SPEAKER

Antonia Ford Willard, Confederate Spy by Michelle Krowl, of the Library of Congress. Antonia is credited with providing the military information during the First Battle of Manassas (1861). General J.E.B. Stuart even declared her an honorary aide-decamp. She was accused of spying for Gen. Mosby, who later denied her. She was thus imprisoned. She married one of her captors, Union Major Joseph C. Willard. Afterwards, they managed the Willard Hotel in Washington D.C. and raised a family.
