New Board Member.

The SWCW Board of Directors is happy to welcome the newest member, Jim Knights. Jim is a retired FBI Special Agent. He received a B.A. from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst and an M.A. from the University of Chicago. A native of New England, one of his great-great-grandfathers served during the Civil War with Co. E, 6th Massachusetts Militia Infantry. In addition to the Society for Women and the Civil War, he is a member of the Seminary Ridge Museum in Gettysburg and the Friends of Gettysburg (Gettysburg Foundation). He has authored several published articles on law enforcement recruiting, including one on the valuable role of women as investigators. 2019 Scholarships.

The Society is accepting essay submissions for the 2019 Marge Estilow and Florence Williams Scholarships, which are awarded to a current high school or college student. The theme of the essay is Women in the Civil War, and scholarship winners receive \$250 and publication of their essay in our quarterly journal, *At Home and in the Field*.

Scholarship winners will be selected based on the quality of their original research on the lives and efforts of women in the Civil War era, specifically the relevance of the topic and the quality of the research, which should be based principally upon the use of primary sources. Microhistory perspectives are welcomed.

Applicants must submit:

- An essay not more than 5 pages in length.
- A bibliography of the primary and secondary sources used.
- A personal biography, not more than 1 page, including age, school attending (or prospective school), and contact information.
