MCCORMICK CIVIL WAR INSTITUTE ON-LINE CIVIL WAR LECTURE SERIES

Jonathan Noyalas, MCWI Director and Keynote Speaker for the 2021 Conference on Women and the Civil War, will be leading a special four-part ZOOM seminar examining various aspects of the Shenandoah Valley's Civil War history. The series will begin June 15, 2020. Each session commences at 7:00 pm EDST.

Monday, 15 June: "Prisoners in Our Own Houses" - The Impact of Stonewall Jackson's 1862 Valley Campaign on the Shenandoah Valley's Civilians. ***This will be of particular interest to those planning to attend SWCW's 2021 conference, which will focus on the wartime civilian experience in the Valley.***

Thursday, 18 June: "Was it Cowardly to Check the Advance of Lee's Army?" - Gen. Robert H. Milroy, the 2nd Battle of Winchester, and the Opening of the Gettysburg Campaign.

Monday, 22 June: "Like a Besom of Destruction" - Union Cavalry, the Third Battle of Winchester, and the Postwar Fight for Reputation.

Thursday, 25 June: "Faded from the Memory of the Average Reader" - The Meaning and Legacy of the Battle of Fisher's Hill.
